## FIRE AT RIMINGTON

This morning, a disastrous fire occurred at the shop of Mr Duckworth, grocer, Rimington, formerly occupied by Mr Townson, which is part of a block of buildings, some of which are old thatched roofs. The fire was observed about 9 o'clock and not withstanding every effort to subdue it, the roof fell in about noon. The origin of the fire was supposed to be a spark from the chimney, or the extreme heat of the sun setting aflame the thatched roof, as the fire is believed to have commenced at the top. The goods were saved by being taken into the street, but the building at the back and the fixtures are destroyed.
